Here are some reflections about Aeschi 9!

The format that we developed and have used all these years is completely a winner. The brief presentations set up the videos that lead into lively discussion by all involved. I would say by the end that perhaps 90% had actively participated in various discussions. There were medical students there who were very funny and quite bright. I lament to some degree how Americanized the meeting has become. There really is now no foreign presence and much of the content is strictly focused on American mental health care (such as it is). There is no doubt that there is a craving for this kind of meeting, with its intimacy and lack of egos, which everyone finds so utterly refreshing. The setting and the hotel really work quite well and create the proper atmosphere for the Aeschi spirit to thrive. People seemed to really enjoy themselves and marvel at how different this meeting was in comparison to others they attend. There is a clear desire for this kind of intimacy, support, and collaboration. For my part, Aeschi is an oasis that exists within an otherwise dismal state of mental health care in the US that is bad and only destined to get worse under our miserable president's incompetent leadership.
